#### **Directors' Notes**

On September 11, 2001, I was home sick from school. My mother called for me to come to the living room. She patted the seat next to her on our couch and said, "I want you to see this." I think she knew that this event would be important, somehow, and felt I needed to witness it. And so together, all the way in Kodiak, Alaska, we watched Tower Two collapse on TV. It was the first, and last, time I had witnessed violence on such a massive scale.

Physically, I was a great distance away from the event, yet I've found myself returning to that day in my mind many times throughout the years. It's something that's stayed with me, as I'm sure it has for many of you.

A few years ago, while visiting family, I found *The Guys* at a library in Ohio. I was immediately struck by the show's humanity, its compassion. *The Guys* explores how communities come together after a tragedy and how we collectively process our grief. I knew after reading it that I wanted to direct this show someday.

By presenting this show now, on the fifteenth anniversary of the event, we hope to not only memorialize those first-responders who gave their lives to save so many others, but also to come together, ourselves, as a community, and remember the importance of compassion in the midst of turbulent times.
